The Certificate IV in Ageing Support is designed for those people who work primarily in residential facilities with defined guidelines and service plans. This qualification covers workers who may have previous experience within the aged care field and carry out activities that promote the well being and lifestyle choices of the aged through personal care and provision of services to individuals with complex needs. People who usually undertake this qualification report to service managers and may be required to supervise and coordinate other workers. This qualification relates to a variety of roles within the aged care sector including accommodation support worker, care supervisor, day activity worker, personal care worker, program coordinator plus more.
